Resolution for Incorporation

A petition for the Incorporation of Millbuck was presented and plat filed in Adm. office next session time appointed for hearing the petition set for June 7<sup>th</sup> 1882 and notice of time ordered advertised

Wednesday June 7<sup>th</sup> 1882 Commissioners met for the purpose of Examining of the petition for the Incorporation of Millbuck which petition has been on file in the Aditors office for more than sixty days and signed by at least thirty electors of said village for the purpose of Incorporating said village the Commissioners found a remonstrance against said petition, but found that the petition contained all the matter required that its statements are true that the name proposed is appropriate. That the limits of proposed corporation accurately described and not unreasonably large or small that the maps are accurate that the persons whose names are subscribed to the petition are electors residing in the Territory of proposed corporation. That notice has been given as required by law that there is the requisite population for the proposed corporation That the Commissioners found all papers in requisite order and correct. Therefore be it ordered that said village be Incorporated and an order to be entered on their journal to the effect that the corporation be organized under the name of Millbuck

Petition to Incorporate the Village of Killbuck, Holmes County Ohio  
To the Commissioners of Holmes County Ohio:

Gentlemen we the undersigned Electors and residents of the Village of Oxford in the County of Holmes and State of Ohio, respectfully pray said Village of Oxford be incorporated as a Village of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Class under the Name and title of Killbuck with boundary lines as follows to wit. Commencing at the South east corner of Waltmans Addition to Oxford, thence north along the east line of said Lots to the north line of said Lots, thence west to the east line of the Killbuck and Resden Branch Rail Road thence north, to the north line of John S. Duncans addition to Oxford, thence west along the north line of Duncans addition, continuing in a direct line to the center of Killbuck River, thence in a southerly direction along the center of said Killbuck River to the intersection of the south line of a twelve foot Alley south of Carpenters Addition to the town of Oxford, thence South 88° east along the south line of said Alley to a point where the east line of Waltmans Addition if projected would intersect, thence north to the place of beginning as plotted in a map marked "A" and hereunto attached and made a part of this Petition as required by the Statute in such case made and provided your petitioners would respectfully state that said Village as plotted contains a population of upwards of two hundred and sixty Inhabitants and that we appoint our Agents to transact all matters as required by the Statute in Relation to the Incorporation of Villages require to J. W. Shrimplin and E. P. Barnes.
