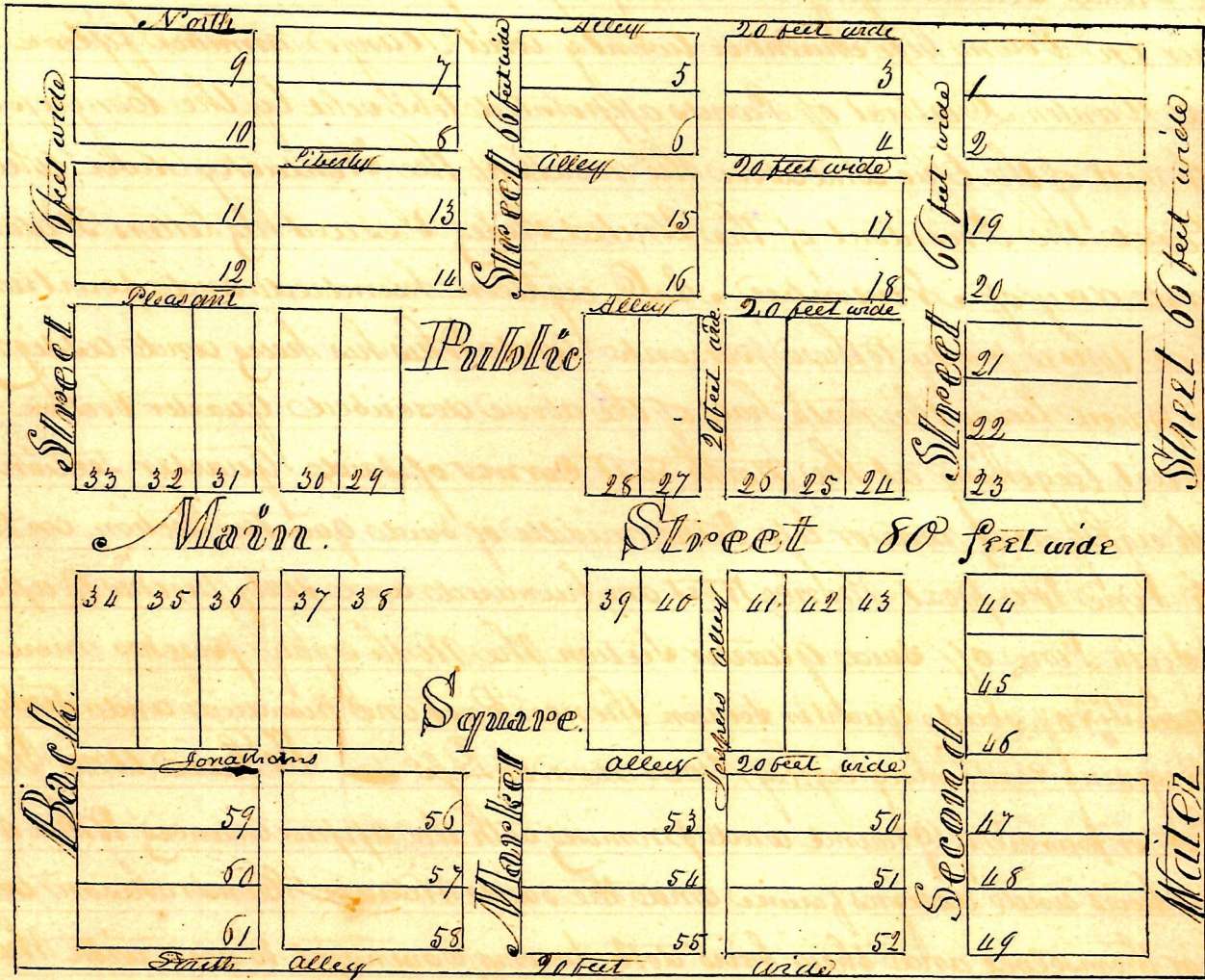

The above plat represents the Town of Wilmington laid out in the South East  
 Quarter of Section Number 11 Township N<sup>o</sup> thirteen of Range N<sup>o</sup> thirteen in the County  
 of Wayne and State of Ohio containing 51 Lots each Lot is 66 feet in front and  
 extending back one hundred and ninety eight feet Main street is eighty feet wide  
 Each other street is sixty six feet wide the Alleys are each twenty feet wide the town  
 is laid out with the Var<sup>o</sup> of the Section Line between Section 11 & 9.
