Surveyed the above described Line Nov. 1850 for W^m Shrimplin - The S. E. corner being in dispute W^m Shrimplin gave notice to the landholders interested by the Establishment of $\frac{1}{4}$ Corner. The Bearing Trees could not be clearly identified and doubt existed as to where the corner should be placed. Samuel Shrimplin was called by W^m Shrimplin to prove that there had been a corner some thirty or 40 years. Samuel Shrimplin (sen) being qualified by me stated that he was among the first settlers in that neighborhood and that he had always considered the S. E. corner of section 10 to be where I placed it; he further stated that he had frequently seen near on a large W. Oak that stood near the corner the number of the T¹p Range &c and supposed that it was the witness to the corner he could not say that he ever saw any other witness trees. The Limber called for in the original notes is the one of W. Oak. I made search for $\frac{1}{4}$ Limber, and found where a W. Oak had stood which agreed with the corner and three section lines. The Hickory I could not satisfactorily find
