

Wm Arnold, recalled, Question by Mr Horton for Mr Spurgeon,
Which side of the hickory was the notch taken out?

Ans. On the north side of the tree or nearly so opposite the stake.

Ques. Had you any information other than that given by Mr Spurgeon as to where the corner was? Ans. None other, than what

I had of my own, by tracing lines; and met Mr Spurgeon, here and ^{he} told me as aforesaid. I never noticed or traced a line east from here or from the stake.

Question by Mr Cole, Did you ever see a tree marked as a sight tree, or a blaze on a line north from the stake, you saw?

Ans. I saw a tree marked as a sight tree immediately north from the stake, at least, it bore all the appearances of a sight tree, having three notches cut on each side; cut on the north and south sides of the tree; a white oak; It is not standing there now, the tree is cut down and the marked part removed.

David Arnold, recalled,

Ques. Did you ever see a sight tree north from the place where Wm. Arnold stated the corner was?

Ans. I did. Saw the same tree that William Arnold has testified to, and took it to be the line north, as to the marks my testimony is the same of William's; the tree is down and the marking part removed. Mr Spurgeon, never claimed any land west of that corner, that he was aware of while I lived on the ridge Spurgeon and myself had no conversation about the line or corner while I lived on the ridge. and further saith not.

Mr. Pind, of lawful age being duly sworn according to law deposited and saith, that he has been along with Mr Samuel Robinson, surveyor sometime after he entered it, and that there appeared to be no difficulty in finding the bearing trees, and found what Mr Robinson took to be the corner. In finding this corner Mr Robinson, commenced on the north side of the section and run south and came out on the south line of the section seven, some fourteen or fifteen rods west of the corner; after finding the corner he commenced and run north; correcting the line along the east line of my land, being a
