

tree or not. During the life time of Anson
 Wheaton County Surveyor, I was present when
 he made a Survey at the west corner of lots
 29nd & 30, 1st & 2^d Tp 9, R 8, and he established the corner
 of those two lots west, and he Wheaton remarked
 that the corner of lots 2nd & 3 (east) 2^d & 3 Tp 9, R 8
 was about 20 feet north of the corner of lots 29nd & 30,
 1st & 2^d Tp 9, R 8. I remember afterwards of seeing
 a corner stone about 20 feet north of the stone
 for lots 29nd & 30. The ground where it stood
 has washed away since. My best recollection
 is, the stone stood near or about where the present
 corner stone is (planted by H. H. Robinson)

At the west corner of lots 2nd & 3, there was a Cooper
 Shop built at the south west corner of lot 3, and
 I heard Washington Finney the owner of the said
 lot say, the corner of said lot, was near the
 corner of the said Cooper Shop. The Cooper
 Shop stood on the north side of the road
 and that trees that were in dispute between
 the owners of lots 2nd & 3, which were on
 the north side of the traveled road, were
 afterwards cut and taken by the owner
 of lot 2.

Thomas Allison being first duly sworn says,
 He from the time he was old enough, saw about
 where the Iron pin now stands, a black oak tree
 which his father always pointed out as the witness
 tree for the East corner of lots 2nd & 3, 2^d & 3 Tp 9, R 8,
 and the tree stood until about 1841, at which
 time it blowed down, and a man by the
 name of David Troyer (a Thresher) hauled it out
 of the road. My Father in my presence remarked,
 the above corner should be established for the
 tree being gone, no other witness tree remained.

The road from the west went on both
 sides of said tree. At the west corner of lots 2nd & 3,
 I remember of seeing the Gum corner witness tree standing
 at the north side of the road, and near a Cooper Shop and S.
